

VO Word Order and Monotheism

Abstract

The relationship between monotheism and the word order of verb (V) and object (O) in declarative sentences of its practiced language is analyzed. The oldest monotheistic religion is the Aten belief of ancient Egypt, which was practiced in the ancient Egyptian language. Abrahamic religions, which are typical monotheistic religions are practiced in the following languages: Judaism was in Aramaic and biblical Hebrew; Christianity was in Aramaic, ancient Hebrew, and Koine Greek; and Islam was in Arabic. The word order of these languages are all verb object (VO). Moreover, I have investigated the relationship between the world's ethnic religions and the word order of their practiced languages. For 284 data points, monotheism is practiced in VO vs. OV as 20 vs. 8. On the other hand, polytheism is practiced in VO vs. OV as 111 vs. 145. From these findings, I conclude that monotheism is more frequently practiced in the VO language than in the OV language.

1 Introduction

I have quantitatively investigated the relationship between the word order of language and the thinking patterns of its speakers. I used the following quantitative measures to express the human thinking patterns: suicide rate and homicide rate (Ehara 2015), distribution of Y-chromosome DNA haplogroups (Ehara 2018), distribution of mitochondrial DNA haplogroups (Ehara 2019), and relative frequency of the short allele of the serotonin transporter gene (5-HTTLPR) (Ehara 2021).

In this paper, I will analyze the relationship between monotheism and word order. The relationship between

monotheism and word order was partly treated in Ehara (2017). However, it only distinguished Abrahamic religions (Judaism, Christianity, and Islam) from other religions. In this paper, I will moreover consider monotheisms other than Abrahamic religions.

I will consider only the word order of verb (V) and object (O) in declarative sentences. This word order feature is the most significant in the word order typology. In this paper, this feature or feature values (VO or OV) will be simply called "word order". Word order data are mainly obtained from Yamamoto (2003) and Dryer and Haspelmath (2013).

My conjecture is that "monotheism is more frequently practiced in the VO language than in the OV language".

2 Monotheism and polytheism

What is monotheism? What is the criterion to distinguish monotheism from polytheism? It is difficult to answer these questions. In this paper, I set the distinction shown in Table 1.

3 Ancient Egypt

Most of the ancient Egyptian religions are polytheisms.

Exceptionally, during the reign of Akhenaten (BC 1364-1347), he introduced monotheism that worships only the Aten (god of the sun). Aten belief is considered the oldest monotheism (Motomura, 2005, pp. 62-74). Aten belief is practiced in the ancient Egyptian language (in the Afro-Asiatic family), which has VO word order.

4 Abrahamic religions

Typical monotheisms are Abrahamic religions (Judaism, Christianity, and Islam). Languages related to these religions and their word orders are listed in Table 2. The word order of Greek (Koine) is obtained from Kirk (1981). The word order of languages in Table 2 are all VO. Only Greek (Koine) belongs to the Indo-European family. Other languages in Table 2 belong to the Afro-Asiatic family.

5 Change to monotheism in Greece and Rome

Ancient Greece and Rome were both in polytheistic cultures. The period that these areas changed to monotheistic culture is considered AD 311 when Roman Emperor Constantine I sanctioned Christianity.

Word order changes in Greek and Latin are listed in Table 3 and Table 4. In Table 4, VO-ratio means the ratio of the number of VO word order sentences in the total

number of VO or OV word order sentences in the document or writer. During the period of changing to monotheism (AD 311), the word orders of Greek and Latin moved from OV predominant to VO predominant (except for Mycenaean Greek).

6 Ethnic religions

Several ethnic religions are monotheistic. I investigated 135 ethnic religions. The number of populations believing these religions is 295, and the number of languages is 294. Combining these data, 320 data points are obtained. 284 data points among them have a word order of VO or OV. In these 284 data points, the number of monotheisms is 28 and the number of polytheisms is 256. Part of the detailed data is listed in Appendix 1^{i,ii}.

The frequency of word orders for monotheism and polytheism is shown in Table 5. In this table, 1417 languages in WALS (all) (Dryer and Haspelmath 2013) are also shown.




Figure 1 Relative frequency of VO languages (VO-ratio)

The relative frequencies of the VO word order languages (VO-ratio) are shown in Figure 1. The VO-ratio of the languages for monotheism is higher compared with polytheism and WALS data (all).

The χ^2 tests to the data in Table 5 are executed. The results are shown in Table 6. The difference between monotheism and polytheism is significant at 1% level, and the difference between monotheism and WALS data (all) is also significant at 5% level. However, the difference between polytheism and WALS data (all) is non-significant.

7 Conclusion

The relationship between word order and monotheism is analyzed. The oldest monotheism or Aten belief was practiced in Ancient Egyptian. Typical monotheisms or Abrahamic religions (Judaism, Christianity, and Islam) were practiced in Egyptian, Aramaic, Hebrew, Koine Greek, or Arabic. These languages all have VO word order. Moreover, an analysis of 135 ethnic religions showed that monotheistic ethnic religions are more frequently practiced in the VO languages than in the OV languages.

One of the future works is to clarify the reason why monotheism is more frequently practiced in the VO language than in the OV language.
